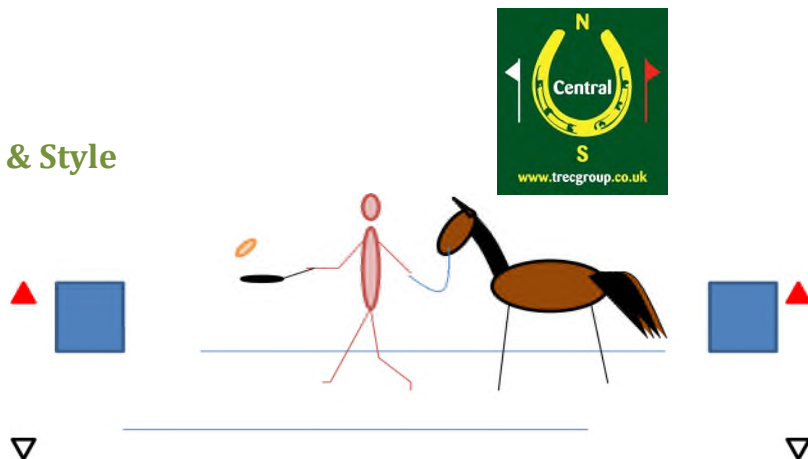


## Pancake Toss

### Scoring Guidelines - Effectiveness & Style

#### Equipment

- 4 poles - total length 8-12m
- 2 pairs red and white flags
- 1 Number
- 1 frying pan
- 1 or 2 'pancakes' made from carpet
- 2 bollards / tables on which to place pan at beginning and end of obstacle



#### Objectives

Demonstrate correct approach of rider and willingness and obedience of the horse.

#### Aim

To show appropriateness of rider's aids and obedience of the horse, whilst completing an unfamiliar task.

#### Features

Obstacle to be completed led & in walk.

Rider collects pan containing pancake from the first bollard and leads their horse through the corridor. Whilst in the corridor the rider will complete one toss of the pancake, catching it back in the pan. Pan and pancake to be placed on second bollard at the end of the obstacle.

#### Effectiveness faults

- Horse refusing to collect or deposit frying pan
- Horse moving during collection / deposit of pan
- Pausing in movement whilst travelling through the corridor
- Feet touching poles
- Dropping the pancake
- Failure to toss pancake

#### Style evaluation

- Calmness and accuracy of the combination
- Position and accuracy of the rider
- Cleanness of pancake toss

#### Marking

- Effectiveness: Marked 7, 4, 1, or 0 depending on the number of faults
- Style: Marked +3 to -2 according to the general marking scheme

#### Penalties

- Brutality: -3 points
- Any step outside the poles will result in a zero score for the whole obstacle.
