1. OPEN (TREC GB Class)

Open to all horse and rider combinations. PTV obstacles equivalent to Level 3/4.

2. OPEN INTERMEDIATE (TREC GB Class)

Open to all horses and riders. PTV obstacles equivalent to Level 2/3.

3. INTERMEDIATE (TREC GB Class)

Horse and rider combination not to have been placed 1st in three or more Intermediate classes, or to have won twice in the Open class at WINTER TREC competitions prior to 1st October 2023. PTV obstacles equivalent to Level 2.

4. PAIRS (CTG Club class)

Open to all horse and rider combinations. Horse rider combinations may compete twice as long as they complete different halves of the course in each round. (No MA – Both horses in arena: one completes first 7 obstacles, other completes the last 7 obstacles) PTV Obstacles equivalent to Level 2.

5. IN HAND (CTG Club class)

Open to all horse and leader combinations. All obstacles to be complete led. PTV Obstacles equivalent to Level 1.

6. NOVICE HORSE (TREC GB Class)

Open to HORSES who have not been placed 1st in two or more Winter League classes prior to 1st October 2023.

PTV obstacles equivalent to Level 1.

7. NEWCOMER (TREC GB Class)

Open to RIDERS not to have been placed 1st in two or more Winter League classes prior to 1st October 2023. PTV obstacles equivalent to Level 1.

Competitors that are overqualified for league classes may not enter them HC as a warm up, prior to the classes that they are eligible for.

Entry Fees:

- TREC GB Leagues Classes (classes 1, 2, 3, 6 & 7):
 - o CTG Members = £14
 - TREC GB Member = £16
- CTG Club Classes (classes 4 and 5):
 - CTG Members = £12
 - TREC GB Members = £14

Riders must be aged 5 years or older All competitors (including TREC GB Blue Members) must be members of a TREC GB Affiliated club or be RED members of TREC GB itself. All competitors must quote a TREC GB or club membership number on the entry form - only fully paid up members of TREC GB will have scores for Classes 1 & 2 counted in the TREC GB Winter League.

What is Arena TREC?

Arena TREC focuses on the MA (Control of Paces) and PTV (Obstacle course) phases of TREC and events are usually run in an indoor or outdoor school.

The PTV is a course of 10 optional obstacles, each with a maximum score of 10 points. To find out more, please look at the *TREC GB Rulebook*

Time Penalties of 1 penalty for every 6 seconds over the time limit will be applied

The MA phase consists of a 2-2.2m wide corridor between 50 and 150m long, along which the rider canters as slowly as possible before returning by walking as fast as possible without breaking pace.

The Winter League will include results from all TREC GB Arena TREC competitions held from 1st October 2023 to 28th April 2024 from Affiliated classes. The best 4 placings for each horse and rider combination will be used to calculate the League standings. If a competitor scores zero in the PTV phase, there will be no league points awarded for that round, even if they are placed in the class.

The highest four scores will be counted for the league. In the event of equal positions the TOTAL actual PTV scores (from 4 events) will be taken into account.

Riders who are not members of TREC GB can join within 48 hours of the competition for their performance at that event to count towards the TREC GB League

If your horse is not on the TREC GB central register, please email a copy of the complete vaccination record from the first two injections in your horses' passport and horse registration details (from the first page), to moulton@trecgroup.co.uk

Health and Safety

The event manager/organiser will take all reasonable precautions to ensure the health and safety of everyone present. For these measures to be effective, everyone must take all reasonable precautions to avoid and prevent accidents occurring and must obey the instructions of the officials and stewards on the day.

Trained First Aiders will be present at the event and should be summoned through an official in the event of an accident.

Competitors are asked to safeguard valuable tack and possessions. Young children must be supervised at all times. Neither the event manager/organiser nor the land/course owners can accept responsibility for loss or injury to persons or animals howsoever caused.

GENERAL RULES & CONDITIONS

Placing will be decided with the rider gaining the highest combined score from the PTV and MA phases taking the first prize. In the event of equality the highest score from PTV will take precedence.

RULES AS PER THE TREC GB RULEBOOK AVAILABLE TO DOWNLOAD FROM WWW.TRECGB.COM

Your attention is particularly drawn to Appendix 8 p119 2022 TREC GB Rulebook (6th edition)

- 1. Competitions are open to all horses and ponies providing that they are a minimum of 4 years old for ridden classes and 1 year old for in hand classes.
- 2. Riders, minimum age of 5 years old, juniors may ride horses and seniors may ride ponies.
- 3. No rider will be permitted to start any phase of the event unless wearing a correctly fitted hard hat with the chin strap correctly fastened meeting one or more of the current standards as listed below:

PAS 015 (2011) provided it has a BSI Kitemark OR an Inspec IC Mark VG1 01.040 (2014-12) provided it has a BSI Kitemark OR an Inspec IC Mark ASTM F1163 (2004a or 04a onwards), providing it has a SEI mark SNELL E2016 (or later), providing it has a SNELL label and number AS/NZS 3838 (2006 onwards), providing it has a SAI Global mark

- 4. If fixed obstacles are used, a current body protector <u>must</u> be used and the Beta standard is changing in Jan 2024 to 2018 labels only. Riders may choose to wear a body protector during any phase of the competition.
- 5. Tack & dress informal but safe. Riders must wear suitable riding footwear.
- 6. Standing Martingales and other fixed reins are forbidden. If a running martingale is used, horse must be led from headcollar and lead rope for led PTV obstacles.

- 7. Whips/Spurs Competitors may carry appropriate riding whips. A whip does not have to be used in all phases. Whips must not exceed 75cm in length, except when riding side saddle when a whip of 1m is permitted. The length of a whip refers to its overall length, including any thong or tassel. **Spurs, if worn, must not exceed 3cm,** must not point upwards and must be rounded. If riders wear spurs they do not have to be worn in all phases.
- 8. The judges' and officials' decision is final and must be complied with at all times. Uncorrected error on PTV course will result in a ZERO score for the PTV. Elimination may result for any of the following reasons: excessive use of whip, abusive language, dangerous riding.
- 9. No horse or pony may compete more than once in any affiliated (TREC GB) class.
